

Reports for games of Oct. 30:

Tigard Varsity White 36, Westview Red 14

The Tigard Varsity White played their eighth and final league game of the season. The 7-0 Tigers showed up at Westview for another rainy afternoon of football. Kick off started on time with the Westview Wildcats kicking on sides to Kevin Henneman at the Tigard 41.

The Tigers had a rare 4 and out and punted with Brady McGetrick stopping the wildcats on their 31. Tigard defense was strong and hot in the cold rain with Marcos Vermelho and Kevin Henderson blowing up the wildcats line. Westview punted and Henderson got a hand on the ball which Tigard recovered on their 35.

Sam Inos had great runs moving the ball to the Tigard 43. With third down and 2 to go Coach Hanson called for the infamous wedge. McGetrick got the ball from the center Alex Treat and with Treat and the rest of the O-line surging forward they created a hole in the D-line with Treat putting a great block on the middle linebacker opening a hole for McGetrick. McGetrick ran straight through the hole and into the end zone at 5:21. With the kick good Tigard was up 6-0 over the cats. With the kick Inos was in the Westview backfield for the stop on their 40 yard line.

Great tackling by Brandon Baker, Henderson, Vermelho and Bryan Baker kept the cats at bay. With third and 12 Westview went to the air connecting for a first down while being immediately hit by Brett Jackson and Inos. The wildcats went to the air again up the middle and Sam Averette picked it off running the ball back to the Tigard 41. McGetrick took the snap rolled out to his right and hit Jarod Gogal in the flat for quick screen pass that resulted in a nice 13 yard pass/run. The next play saw Westview coming on the blitz forcing McGetrick out of the pocket to his right. Just as McGetrick was about to be tackled Bryan Baker came rushing in putting a big hit on a Westview linebacker opening up a huge gap with McGetrick going 46 yards for the Tigard touchdown.

With another great PAT kick the Tigers at 2:17 in the quarter were up 16-0. Tigard kicked again and Brandon Dodak, Inos and Vermelho were all in a Tigard team tackle keeping the cats at their 25 yard line. Westview went right into passing throwing over the middle with McGetrick coming up big for the interception running the ball back all the way to the Westview house for another Tigard touchdown. With great protection on the PAT the kick was good through the uprights with Tigard leading 24-0, with 1:56 left in first quarter. Carrie Watts had a great open field tackle on the kick return and stopped the cats on their 18 yard line. Dorian Grimes played tough and had several key tackles at the line to keep the cats in check.

Second quarter saw the wildcats working the ball and even with great tackling by Watts, Jackson, Averette and the rest of the D-line they worked the ball to the Tigard 38. Going to the air again Westview threw short to the flat with Jake Sanders intercepting the ball. With a strong run he moved the ball down to the Westview 25 before being forced out. With the score 24-0 and a lot of game left Coach Hanson went with a 43 yard field goal attempt. McGetrick's kick was short left and Westview took over on their 20 yard line.

Strong defense by Grimes and Watts along with the rest of the team forced the cats to throw. Brett Jackson got his second pick of the season and ran it back to the Westview 30. With 4:06 left in the quarter McGetrick went for his second field goal attempt of the game. From 40 yards the kick was up and to the left hitting the upright and dropping down. Westview again took over on their 20. Dylan Osborne and Bryan Baker got right into it holding the cats back with more great team tackling. The wildcats went to the air and Dodak and Watts hit the receiver the moment he got the ball. Treat and Dodak contained the middle and nothing moved on the cats latest drive.

At one point six Tigers were in on one tackle. Treat had a nice open field tackle that stopped the runner on the Tigard 36. The whole D-line continued to stop the cats and the first half ended with Tigard up 24-0

Second half saw the Tigers kicking with Brandon Baker stopping the cats on their 34. Third quarter saw Westview passing on every down with Jake Sanders making a great defensive play on a quick slant pass keeping the ball from getting to the receiver. Averette tipped a thrown ball and Jackson almost caught his third interception of the season. Westview went four and out and Tigard took over on their 39. McGetrick passed on first down hitting Henneman on a slant left pass for a first down. McGetrick then hit Osborne on a pass over the middle down to the cats 29. Watts got the hand off and took it up the middle to the West-view 28.

Tigard went for another field goal attempt at 6:07 from 38 yards out. The kick was left. Westview once again took over on their 2. They worked the ball adding a good mix of pass and run plays to move the ball down to the Tigard 31. Bryan Baker caused two fumbles that unfortunately the cats recovered each time. At 5:10 Westview handed off to the back who then threw over the middle connecting with a receiver for a wildcats touchdown. Their PAT was good and the score was 24-8 Tigard. Inos got the kick and moved the ball to the Tigard 26.

Inos and McGetrick continued to move the ball to their 40. With the snap McGetrick went to the air hitting Gogal on a dead run straight down the sideline for a 60 yard toss and run for a Tigard touchdown. The PAT took a knee and the score was 30-8. Henneman and Watts stopped the cats on their 41. Dodak and Grimes continued to push them back. Westview went to the air and Averette had a great solo open field tackle to keep the wildcats out of the end zone on the Tigard 16. Westview tossed again over the middle and it was picked off by Gogal who ran the ball back to the Tigard 20.

Four quarter saw Tigard with the ball and McGetrick completed another pass to Dodak over the middle for an 8 yard gain. Inos continued his great running and took the ball to the 50. Watts go a couple of hand-offs and continued fighting up the middle for a few yards. Watts got the toss on another slant pass to the flat and picked up big yardage moving the ball to the Westview 30. Watts followed up the pass with another 5 yard run to the 25. Averette got the call and added more yardage onto the runs moving the ball to Westview 19. Watts moved the ball to the 10 and at 3:34 behind great O-line blocking he took the handoff up the middle for another Tigard touchdown. The PAT took a knee and Tigard was up 36-8. Taylor Seufferheld ran down on kick return and stopped

the cats on their 35 yard line. On a wildcat pass Watts got a hand on the ball for an incomplete pass. Jordan Galinat and Alex Chamberlin teamed up for a great Tigard team tackle keeping the cats to their 36.

Brandon Long had a great open field tackle on a receiver just as he got the ball keeping the receiver to zero rushing yards. At 2:24 left in the half Tigard took over on downs at the Westview 36. On a rare fumble Tigard lost the ball and the cats got it back. After a few run plays Westview passed up the middle over the Tigard secondary and ran the ball into the end zone while we were trying to strip the ball away from the receiver.

At 1:51 left Westview tried for two on the PAT but the kick was blocked by Chamberlin who got a mighty Tiger paw up in the air to bat the ball away. Henneman recovered the onside kick under a wave of wildcats to hold onto the ball. Tigard let the clock run out and the Tigers won 36-14 to go undefeated in their season.

Coach Hanson said after the game, "We dominated the game, the kids played hard with heart and most of all as the great team they are. I'm very proud of the players and all they have accomplished this year." The 8-0 Tigers start the playoffs next Saturday at 7:30 p.m. playing at Aloha High School.

Tigard Varsity Green 36, Westview Blue 7

The Tigers hosted the Westview Wildcat's in Week 7. Despite the steady and heavy downpour, the Tigard Varsity "Gang Green" squad started quickly when Thomas Vickers recovered the opening kick-off. The next play JT Greenough hit Landon Floyd for a 47 yard touchdown pass.

Thereafter, the defensive line play of Brett Leitherer, Jacob Logan, Jacob Pond, Austin Goodhouse, Tovia Murga, Jimmy Ha, Bryce Tucker, Ethan Tingy, and Paul Vickers, bottled up the Westview spread running game. Tigard linebackers Brendan Rude, Alex Compton, Thomas Vickers, Joel Johnson and Ryan Bay rallied to the football to prevent Westview from obtaining any rhythm on offense. The defensive secondary play of Tyler Walker, Kyle Baldes, Landon Floyd, Dillon Kanhalikhan and JJ Caufield was stout. Baldes, Murga, Thomas Vickers and Paul Vickers all had fumble recoveries in the game for the Tigers.

Offensively, the Tigers ground attack was lead by Tyler Walker, Landon Floyd, Alex Compton, Bren-dan Rude and Thomas Vickers. Walker led the Tigers with 111 yards on the ground and two touchdowns in the first half. Walker received a much deserved break in the second half from Thomas Vickers. Vickers rushed for 105 yards and a touchdown. Tigard's running backs were the beneficiaries of great down field blocking by wide receivers Jake Spadafora and JJ Caufield. On special teams, the battery of Paul Vickers, Tyler Walker and Ryan Bay were 3 for 3 in PATs. With the victory, the Tigard Varsity Green is 6-1 on the season.
